During the simulation, participants role-play the lives of low-income families, including single parents, people with disabilities, and senior citizens on Social Security. The task of each family is to provide food, shelter, and other basic necessities during the four, 15-minute weeks." "Families" interact with community resources provided through the simulation. Although there is role-playing, CAPS is not a game. It is a simulation that enables participants to view poverty from different levels and utilize knowledge gained to discuss potential change within communities. AC/C TECH SPECIALIZED TECHNICAL TRAINING FOR MAINTENANCE **PROFESSIONALS**

AC/C TECH ONLINE TRAINING PROGRAM: Executive Directors, Administrators, IAHA Educational Board Members, and other maintenance decision makers should make plans to attend the AC/C TECH online training program. You will learn details about a web-based training program designed to take the guess work out of maintaining an apartment community and repairing equipment; however small, large, or unique. Specifically, the program contains four key modules:

- Web-Based Classroom
- Online Technical Support
- Q & A Bulletin Board
- Virtual Coffee House

GENERAL WIRING MAINTENANCE: This course involves diagnosing and repairing wiring components inside the residence. Your technicians will learn how to correctly install duplex receptacles, wall switches, lighting fixtures, GFCI's, AFCI's, fire and smoke detectors, 120 volt special purpose circuits, 240 volt range and dryer circuits, low voltage doorbell circuits, and more. Your technicians will also learn basic principles of electricity, VOM and Amp meter usage, wiring diagram interpretation, and NEC codes. The course will conclude with basic points of electrical safety for the home and workplace.

Thursday 04/14/2016 9:00 - 12:00

INTERIOR BUILDING MAINTENANCE: This course develops skills in maintaining the interior upkeep of a property and to ensure that all vacant apartment units are thoroughly restored to a "market ready" condition, and in a timely manner. More specifically, your technicians will learn procedures for repairing interior components such as ceilings, walls, floors, stairs, doors, cabinets, trim, and baseboards. They will also inspect appliances, HVAC equipment, plumbing fixtures, and the electrical system for safety and functionality.

PLUMBING MAINTENANCE: This course develops skills in understanding the anatomy of a plumbing system and how to make repairs at kitchen sinks, bathroom sinks, tubs, showers, toilets, and water heaters. Your technicians will also learn how to work with PVC, copper, galvanized, and black pipe. Other topics include tools for

the trade, thawing frozen pipes, and opening clogged drains. Emphasis will be placed on making repairs in a safe, efficient and productive manner.

AIR CONDITIONING MAINTENANCE: Residential air conditioning principles are studied in detail but with an emphasis on diagnosing, repairing, and tweaking the unit for optimum efficiency. Students will develop skills in understanding the refrigeration cycle, examining the components, interpreting the electrical wiring diagram, tracing the sequence of operation, analyzing the compressor, charging the system, making repairs, and conducting planned maintenance activities.



ASBESTOS 16-HOUR OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE
