Effective January 1, 2012, Public Act 97-0632 established the "Local Debt Recovery Program" to allow units of local government to collect outstanding debt in coordination with the Illinois Comptroller's Office. The Act modified the State Comptroller Act (15 ILCS 404/10.05), adding units of local government, school districts, public institutions of higher education, and housing authorities to the entities available to utilize the procedure. IDROP provides units of local government with an inexpensive collection tool against debtors who are anticipating funds from the State of Illinois.
